Breaking Open the Book

The Gospel, or 'good news' was first proclaimed by Jesus, after his resurrection, the one who spoke the Gospel became the one spoken about.

The Gospel is the good news about the establishment of the Kingdom or Reign of God. Jesus proclaims and actualises the Gospel. Jesus is the good news.

It was not until about 150AD, some years after writing of the four Gospel accounts that the word 'Gospel' came to be used to refer to the book that contains the Gospel.
