# Teachings

- Death is a consequence of sin.
- Passing through death makes it possible for us to experience the fullness of God's life.
- Death has meaning because of Christ's resurrection.
- Death is transformed by Christ.
- Life is changed not ended.
- Jesus death and resurrection conquered death.
- That there is life after death.
- There is a resurrection of the body.
- There is a resurrection of the dead for judgement.
- There is a final judgement on the 'Last Day' when Jesus will return.
- People will be judged according to their faith in Christ and their actions.
- The meaning of our life is found in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus celebrated in the Eucharist.
- In our life we are free to accept or reject God's love.

# More Teachings

- Purgatory:
- After death because of the effects of sin some may need to go through purification to be ready for complete union with God (2 Maccabees 12:46).
- It is a process rather than a place.
- Heaven:
- People who die in God's grace will meet God "face to face" (1 Corinthians 13:12).
- Experience the fullness of God's life and love (1 John 3:2; 1 Corinthians 2:9).
- Communion of Saints.
- Hell:
- God continually offers his love and forgiveness.
- Hell is the state of total separation from God.
