- Discuss the effects of the long period of time in which the Bible was formed

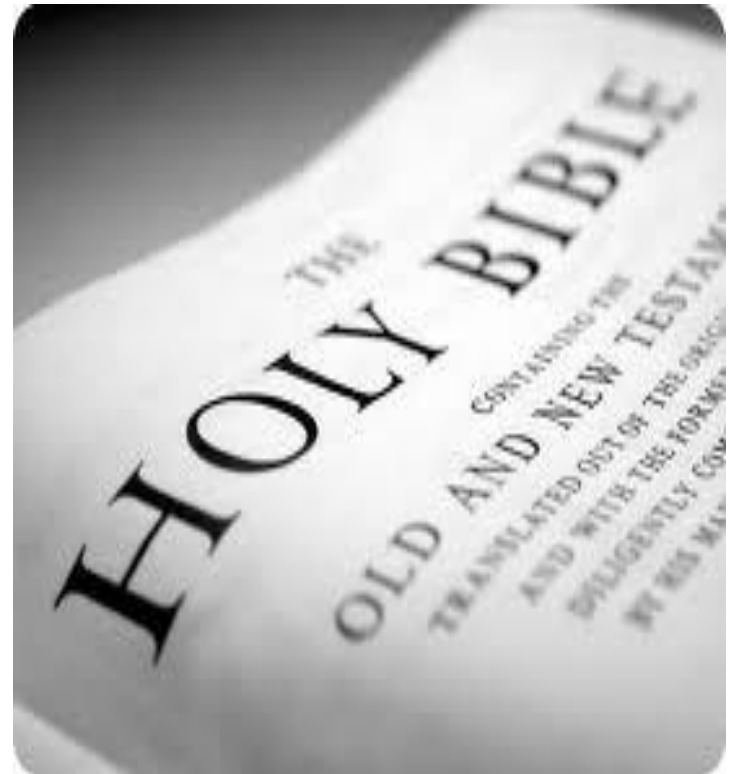
# Part 1: God's Revelation
